Our club hosts a number of events through the ski season that not only build a strong ski community, but also promote our club to our surrounding area. Many thanks to all the volunteers who make these events happen. You are what make this club so great.

Masters- Drop In

Promotes ski development for all levels in a fun and social environment. Thank-you to Cobey Oliemans for coordinating this event.

Community Events

- **Welcome Day** was held February 18th. Thank-you to Tenley for coordinating and to Peter and Jill for providing free rental gear. Extensive outreach to the local community brought in record numbers. Estimates are about 200 people showed up. 20+ volunteers contributed ~70 hours total.

The Race Committee organizes our local races. These races provide a fun environment where members and out of town visitors can enjoy our trails, sometimes skiing a little harder than normal! Thank-you to Jen Plummer for leading the Race Committee this last year.

Finances

Most of the funding for a paid club coach comes from the BC Gaming Grant. Irene Ronalds led the grant proposal submission, and contributed many extra hours into the submission to ensure we met all the gaming grant requirements.

The NSDP raised funds through the Wellness Program and Ski Booster activities. Through the Wellness program, the BV Credit Union gave the NSDP a \$5000.00 donation in exchange for sessions of skill development. The Ski Boosters raised funds through bottle drives, ski swap, concessions, ticket booth and the dessert night.
