

WHAT IF THERE'S AN EMERGENCY:

There are 4 emergency kits located at junctions on our trails in case something major happens, locations shown on the trail map below and on our website: [BV Nordic safety instructions on our website](#)

- Kiosks contain a backpack that has supplies to keep an injured skier warm while someone goes for help
- If someone is injured on the trail find the nearest kit & stabilize the skier
- Follow emergency instructions posted by the furnace room in the lodge (1st floor near the telephone)
- We have no ski patrol; skiers can familiarize themselves with the [BV Nordic safety instructions on our website](#)
- Remember cell service is very spotty on the Nordic trails & at the lodge


NORDIQ CANADA CLUB FUNDRAISER:

WEEKLY DOSE OF DOG SHAMING:

Cross-Country Ski BC's protocol on dogs: *dog owners must have control of their dogs at all times*, more info: [CCBC dog policy](#). This is non-negotiable & is the basis for responsible dog use in public spaces, but also subjective.

We must use the precautionary principle: presume that your perception of control may be different from others & error on the side of caution; a dog jumping on someone represents an owner not in control of their dog. A dog pooping on the classic track is not in the control of the owner, but something we can clean up.

More- When skiing with your dog, or anywhere with limited oncoming visibility, keep right.

More still- Notice where you stop to have a break, are you potentially in the way? This is not just on dog trails.

Yup, there's more- Be aware of others with a different comfort level when you are skiing past other folks

Lastly- Be aware that others have different levels of control and agility.




2024/2025 BV NORDIC DOG TRAIL SURVEY UPDATE:

Do you think that negative interactions declined and/or safety increased this season?



When you ski these trails, do you ski:






HOLIDAY HUSTLE RECAP:



SUMMARY OF HOLIDAY HUSTLE RESULTS:

- Caedmon Dunbar (former BV racer), skied the route a whopping 16 times, the most anyone has skied the Holiday Hustle since inception!
- David Doogan-Smith had the fastest overall time in 17:24 (& fastest skate time).
- Ava Wimbush, another BV race program alumna, had the fastest skate time for a woman in 20:11.
- Bryden Rigets, On the classic side, was the fastest in at 26:37 for the men.
- Megan Peloso, followed closely behind in 26:51 for the women. This was also fast enough for 9th overall!



There are options for all ages, skills & fitness levels. Distances are: 1 km, 4 km, 9 km, 20 km, 40 km, & 60 km; course maps can be [viewed here](#). For each distance, skiers choose classic or free technique. Can't decide which one? There's even a 40 km skiathlon option where participants race 20 km classic technique followed by free technique for their 2nd 20 km lap. You won't want to miss this celebration of cross-country skiing and our club.




DROP IN SUCCESS:
