BVXCC Develop Partnership with Wet'sinkwa Community Forest

Over the past 2 years the ski club has been working closely with the Wet'zinkwa Community Forest Corporation (WCFC) to develop an understanding of how our two organizations will co-exist on the same operating area in a way that is mutually beneficial. Some of the topics discussed include skier safety, aesthetics, impacts from harvesting on skier access, trail development, revenue sharing and access to timber. What has evolved from these discussions is a framework for a partnership relationship between the ski club and the WCFC.

The key elements of the part-

nership include:

a Memorandum of Understanding that facilitates the ski club's input into forest management activities adjacent to the ski trails: a framework for revenue sharing on the profits from harvesting adjacent to the ski trails, and an opportunity for direct granting to the ski club to support delivery of our ski programs to the community. This year the ski club was very fortunate to receive \$25,000 in grant money from WCFC; and a further \$15,000 has been committed for next year. As part of the partnership the ski club is able to assist the WCFC in providing



recreational opportunities from the operating area for community enjoyment.

The WCFC is a joint venture of the Town of Smithers and the Village of Telkwa. In 2007 the corporation was successful in their bid for a community forest license and were awarded a tenure to operate in a defined area on Hudson Bay Mountain which encompasses the Bulkley Valley Nordic Centre. The community forest tenure is a unique forest tenure arrangement that

transfers decision-making to communities that wish to more fully participate in the steward-ship of local Crown forest resources. It gives communities exclusive rights to harvest timber, as well as the opportunity to manage forest resources such as timber and plant products, recreation, wildlife, water and scenic views.

To date timber harvesting hasn't started in the area directly adjacent to the Nordic Center under this new community forest agreement. In the next year we can expect some activity near the ski trails. In particular we would like to address the mountain pine beetle killed trees and reduce the hazard from danger trees in the heavily impacted areas on the Pine Creek trails.

Smithers is honoured to be one of the 1,036 Canadian communities to host the Olympic Flame as it travels from coast to coast to coast across Canada in the 106 days leading up to the Opening Ceremony of the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Winter Games.

The Vancouver 2010 Olympic Torch Relay, presented by Coca-Cola and RBC and supported by the Government of Canada, represents an extraordinary opportunity to showcase our community to the world.

On January 30, 2010, the eyes

of the world will turn to Smithers as we host the Olympic Flame in an exciting evening celebration at Heritage Park. We have some truly memorable and inspirational entertainment planned to celebrate our day as an Olympic town. In addition, Coca-Cola, RBC and the Government of Canada have some wonderful entertainment prepared to help us celebrate this exciting occasion. The Vancouver 2010 Olympic Torch Relay represents an incredible opportunity to unify not only our community but all Canadians, and generating tremendous pride on our country as we celebrate the coming of the Games.
