





Early Season Grooming at BV Nordic Centre (submitted by Jan):

The team of relentless volunteers are willing to pack any snow with our smaller machines & have been going at it for a week (until the rain hit us). The Early Season team is led by "Maverick" AKA Kevin Kriese and their goal is to create a good quality track on our priority one trails (Broadway, Logging roads, Wetzin'kwa, Demo Forest, Biathlon Loops) on the Lodge side.



Head's up people, I've got a strong premonition that she's going to keep posting volunteer shout outs until we get back to pre-covid levels of engagement...

Pooch Paradise and Hound Heaven are our priority one trails on Pine Creek side, and as soon as possible, they hope to pack down the snow on priority two trails (Down the Mountain, Valley View, Golden Eye, Northern Lights, Perimeter, Down & Out on Lodge side. Pine Creek 5,7 1).

Once those two priorities have been taken care of, they will move onto the rest of our steeper more uneven trails that require more snow coverage before any machines can go on them. I take my hat off to this eager crew that ensure that we will have a great snow base until April. Thank You to all of you!

The Science of Grooming? The ESP starts working the first 10 cm of snow either with our tracked Ranger (side by side) without any drags or hooked up with a roller. The goal here is to punch down the snow and take out the air. Once this is accomplished, they stealth move into using either our electric snowmobile with a drag for working out the lumps and bumps. Stage three is the same set-up but this time they're using teeth and roller, and maybe the track pad to set that first classic track that you have been waiting sooo long for.





New Groomer? But wait... Where is the new 500K snowcat you may ask? Not to worry, this large & heavy machine will not come out on the trails until we feel that we have enough snow coverage to safely operate the machine with its tiller & tracks. This will ensure that both the machine & our trials are performing at their best.

Opening Day? The million-dollar question: When do we open!? Or like I would rephrase it: when <u>can</u> we open? The answer is simple. We'll open when we are able to achieve the above goals, and we feel that the trails are safe. Realistically, we need 10+ cm to be able to open our priority one trails. Go ahead, do your snow dance! We almost had some trails skiable last week but got set back a bit by warm rains. Cooler temperatures and more snow is coming so we might be able to open some of our trails soon.



FYI, a few keen skiers have been seen out on the trails already. That is OK, but not recommended unless you have some old rock skis and enjoy the challenge of rough, ungroomed snow.

Last but not least: Be aware that our trails are not currently open, and any skiing is at your own risk. Our operators do not expect skiers on the trails prior to opening, so please be mindful about this! As we're not open, our crews can be on a trail at anytime, anywhere.




